AKC Canine Good Citizen Test Items

- 1. Accepting a Friendly Stranger: Evaluator greets Handler.
- 2. Sitting Politely for Petting: Evaluator pets dog, dog must show no signs of shyness or resentment.
- 3. Appearance and Grooming: Evaluator inspects dog, combs or brushes lightly, examines ears and each front foot. You may wish to bring your dog's own brush to the evaluation. You are also allowed to lift your dog's paws, simply tell the Evaluator that you would like to do so.
- 4. Out for a Walk: Handler takes dog for a short walk including right turn, left turn, about turn and stop.
- 5. Walking Through a Crowd: Dog and Handler walk close to several people; dog may show casual interest but not jump up.
- 6. Sit and Down On Command / Staying In Place: Handler shows dog can do a sit and a down, then chooses either position, leaves dog and goes to the end of a 20 ft. line and returns immediately.
- 7. Coming When Called: With dog still on 20 ft. line, handler walks out 10 ft. and calls the dog.
- 8. Reaction to Another Dog: Two handlers and dogs approach, shake hands, exchange pleasantries, move on; dogs can show casual interest to either the Handler or the other dog.
- 9. Reaction to Distractions: Distractions are presented; dog may not panic or show aggression.
- 10. Supervised Separation: Handler goes out of sight for 3 minutes. Dog is held on 6 foot lead by Evaluator's assistant. The dog may not display any signs of stress.

IMPORTANT NOTES

- Please show up 10-15 minutes prior to your testing time, to allow the test to begin promptly. If for some reason, you find you are unable to attend your confirmed test time, please contact the CGC Chairperson as soon as possible. It is very likely that others would like to take your place. There are no refunds if you do not show up at the test.
- Treats and toys are not allowed during the test, but verbal praise and petting is encouraged.
- Exercise your dog just prior to the test and between exercises if necessary. A dog who eliminates
 during the test is dismissed.
- <u>Acceptable Collars</u> for the test: Leather Buckle, Nylon Buckle, Slip or Martingale.
 Unacceptable Collars for the test: Pinch/Prong, Head Halters or Gentle Leader.
- <u>Acceptable Leads</u> for the test: Leather or Nylon, up to 6 feet.
 Unacceptable Leads for the test: Retractable, Chain, or any line longer than 6 feet.
- As the handler, you can really only test one dog at a time. If you want to test more than one dog, please sign up for more than one testing date.
- No dog ever "fails" this test, however some items may require further training. A dog that shows signs of aggression may be dismissed at the Evaluator's discretion.
